1. About Applicant Eligibility

• The applicant eligibility for the Regular Admission is described in the Guidelines for Applicants to the 2026 Master's Course Graduate School of Frontier Sciences, The University of Tokyo (Hereinafter referred to as the Guidelines for Applicants).

2. About Application

- · Applicants must upload the documents to be submitted through the online application site during the application period specified in the Guidelines for Applicants.
- · Applicants for Regular Admission can apply only for Schedule A.
- · Applicants are required to submit the PDF file of the filled "Master's Course Applicant Information Sheet" at the time of application by uploading it. Note the following.
 - (1) Applicants must indicate at the time of application whether or not they will declare the desired laboratory.

 Applicants are not allowed to change the desired laboratory after the application is closed. The decision on the acceptance of their application will not be affected by whether or not they declare the desired laboratory at the time of application.
 - (2) If applicants declare the desired laboratory, the applicants must indicate it at the time of application.
 - (3) Accepted applicants who did not declare the desired laboratory at the time of application, and who are not assigned to the desired laboratory will be assigned to one of the laboratories following admission, based on their choice of laboratories and academic performance after admission (post-admission laboratory assignment). The post-admission laboratory assignment applies to the Laboratory of Applied Bioresources, the Laboratory of Advanced Marine Biosciences, or the Laboratory of Cancer Biology, in addition to all core laboratories.
 - (4) During the oral examination, applicants to certain laboratories may be asked to specify a faculty member as a supervisor. The information provided will not affect the decision on admission. For details, contact the relevant faculty member before applying. The following faculty member does not recruit students.

4. About Enrollment

- · New students are generally expected to enroll in April 2026.
- Accepted applicants may be permitted to enroll in October 2025, if they wish to do so. Applicants who wish October 2025 enrollment must contact the Admissions Committee of the Department of Integrated Biosciences before submitting their application. Note that the waiver for October enrollment is granted only to accepted applicants who are assigned to their desired laboratory during the application process, which means that the desired laboratory must be declared at the time of application. Accepted applicants who are not assigned to their desired laboratory will be

allocated to April 2026 enrollment and will be assigned to one of the laboratories following admission, based on their choice of laboratories and academic performance after admission (post-admission laboratory assignment). Non-Japanese applicants planning to newly enter Japan are not eligible to choose October 2025 enrollment.

· Applicants are not allowed to change their planned month of enrollment for their convenience after submitting their application.

1. About Applicant Eligibility

 The applicant eligibility for Special Selection for Applicants with Overseas Education is described in the Guidelines for Applicants to the 2026 Master's Course Graduate School of Frontier Sciences, The University of Tokyo (Hereinafter referred to as the Guidelines for Applicants).

2. About Application

- · Applicants must upload the documents to be submitted through the online application site during the application period specified in the Guidelines for Applicants.
- · Applicants may apply for Schedule A and B. Applicants cannot apply for Schedule B when they pass the examination according to Schedule A.
- · Applicants are required to submit the PDF file of the filled "Master's Course Applicant Information Sheet" at the time of application by uploading it. Note the following.
 - (1) Those who wish to apply under this special selection must declare the intention.
 - (2) Those who wish to apply under this special selection must declare the desired laboratory and the name of the desired supervisor at the time of application.
 - (3) The following faculty member does not recruit students.

the enrollment in October 2025 and in April 2026 may be permitted for accepted applicants in Schedule A and Schedule B, respectively. Applicants who wish to enter in October 2025 in Schedule A or those who wish to enter in April 2026 in Schedule B must contact the Admissions Committee of the Department of Integrated Biosciences before submitting their application.
